An extract from the Constitution

Clause 4.1 The basic objects of the Association are to promote the advancement of Irish culture by;

- (a) Fostering social interaction between the Irish born, those of Irish descent, and those interested in Irish culture.
- (b) Providing a contact point for the newly arrived and visiting Irish in Tasmania.
- (c) Carrying out such activities as the Committee or members consider suitable to advance the standing of the Irish in Tasmania.
- (d) Publicising the activities of the Association throughout Tasmania, and
- (e) Affiliating with other Irish-Australian associations around Australia.

The Committee:

The Officers of the Association are the President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. Each must be financial and the President and Vice President must be born in Ireland to hold office.

The Committee comprises the Officers and three "ordinary" members.

All are elected at the AGM and hold office until the conclusion of the next AGM but are eligible for re-election.
